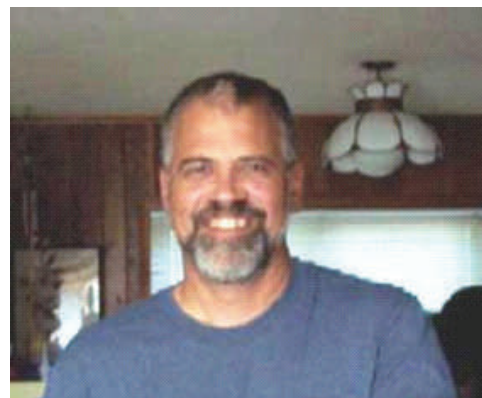
President's Column

MHEIA PLUS MOE EQUALS MORE OPPORTUNITIES FOR MISSOURI YOUTH

As Hunter Ed Instructors we all know that one of our main goals is to educate hunters about the importance of becoming involved. That involvement can take many forms from something as simple as joining an organization that works to benefit wildlife and its habitat all the way up to actually recruiting and mentoring new hunters in the outdoor activities we all love so much. MDC as well as other State Wildlife Agencies know all too well the importance of recruitment and retention of new hunters. That task is a monumental one that will require so much more than any one agency can possibly accomplish alone. It will take a "grass root effort" by other organizations and individuals as well if we ever hope to be successful in this endeavor. Based upon the latest figures that have been published Missouri has the distinction of being one of the few, if not the only state, to actually increase their hunter numbers in the past decade. Obviously this is due in large part to the various Youth Hunt programs and permits that MDC has initiated over the years but more needs to be done. This is where an organization such as the Missouri Outdoors Experience will play such a vital role.

We were fortunate enough to have one of the MOE representatives attend the MHEIA Annual Workshop in March and he was able to provide quite a bit of information on what the MOE has accomplished this past year. They completed a very successful Youth Deer Clinic and Hunt along with setting up an annual 3-D shoot for the youngsters and providing their expertise at a well attended Youth Fishing Day. They also assisted with a couple of Youth Turkey Clinics and Hunts in 2007. They have already scheduled numerous events for 2008 starting with an MOE Youth Turkey Clinic and Hunt. All of this is quite an accomplishment when you realize that this group was not formed until late in 2006. Those activities certainly speak volumes for this group's dedication to their mission statement of "Leaving a Legacy of Outdoor Traditions". This group of concerned and dedicated outdoors enthusiasts has certainly embraced the idea of getting all youngsters involved in the outdoors in whatever way they possibly can. Currently they are conducting most of their events in central Missouri however they want to take this show "on the road" as it were and eventually spread out to all areas of Missouri. A lack of manpower, as is almost always the case, is the biggest stumbling block in that effort and hopefully the MHEIA along with the vast network of Hunter Education Instructors throughout all of the counties in this state will be able to provide some much needed assistance with MOE's quest.

I was quite surprised and very pleased at the number of instructors at the workshop who, upon hearing the presentation from MOE, were immediately questioning the representative on how to go about doing some of these youth events. The MOE has worked extensively with the MDC and the various agents in their area in an effort to fully utilize the resources that MDC has to offer. The knowledge they have gained in working with MDC and local landowners appeared to be a key point that many of the instructors wanted to get more information about. This interaction between our two organizations can only lead to bigger and better programs for the youth in Missouri and hopefully it will facilitate an expansion into all of the MDC Regions. This should truly be a win-win situation for the MOE, the MHEIA and the future outdoor enthusiasts of our state. With this goal in mind a motion was presented to provide space in the MHEIA newsletter for the MOE to publish their upcoming events and provide ongoing information to our membership as to what the MOE is trying to accomplish. Apparently everyone present at the meeting felt this was something the MHEIA needed to get behind as there was no problem in getting that motion approved.

The MOE does have a website which is www.missourioutdoorexperience.com and I would suggest you take the time to check it out for yourself. They have a really neat area that is just for the kids and there are some very interesting articles from some of these new hunters about their experiences. There are lots of pictures you can view from their various events that they participated in during 2007. One innovative segment of their website is the "Camoe 4 Kids" program where a person can donate their slightly used camo that youngsters seem to outgrow so quickly and then the MOE will pass that on to someone that needs it at no charge. They also host an MOE forum where a lot of the idea exchanges take place. This

past fall they were able to create an entire coloring book dealing with various aspects of nature for each letter of the alphabet all via input from participants of the forum. Once they have funding in place they will be able to produce and distribute these MOE coloring books to our young future sportspersons. CFM REPORT

Don Harris

CFM's annual spring conference was held Feb. 22, 23 & 24 at the Lodge of Four Seasons in Lake Ozark. Friday evening was the Annual Awards Ceremony. Saturday was devoted to various committee reports and framing of resolutions to be presented to the various state agencies in support of new regulations.

I attended the committee on deer and Turkey. The 2007 deer season was down about 7%. Total deer harvested was 300,915 compared to 324,425 in 2006. The changes in deer hunting regulations are still under consideration. Being considered are, changes in the regular gun, black powder and antlerless seasons and/or expanding the four point restriction to state wide.

The 2007 spring turkey harvest was down about 10% total harvest was 48,500 birds. The fall harvest was about 10,000. Changes in the turkey regulations for this year are, all day hunting during the youth season. Missouri is no longer number one in turkey hunting, but still ranks in the top percentages of harvested birds.

Two resolutions were presented from this committee.

1. To extend the Missouri Spring Turkey Season Hours until the end of shooting light in order to promote youth participation.
2. Establish a Share the Harvest Endowment Fund to help in funding the Share the Harvest program.

During 2007 Operation Game Thief answered 1,031 calls, resulting in 348 total convictions. The total rewards paid were \$12,350.

CFM is encouraging all members of their affiliates to become CFM members. This is one way we as Hunter Education Instructors can have a voice in the legislative process involving issues which concern us.

The CFM fall conference is Sept. 12-14 at Camp Clover Point, Lake Ozark.

The Treasurer's Report was given by Treasurer Don Harris. Bass Pro made a donation of \$1000.00 for silent auction items for annual conference. A returned check was discussed and attempts to recover these funds will be made. There was an ending balance of \$8,839.31 in the Association Budget.

A motion to accept Treasurer's report was made by Don Harris and was seconded by Dan Evans. A vote was taken and motion passed unanimously.

Discussion then ensued as to setting up the annual conference for 2009.
